Through their efforts, these neighborhoods will demonstrate practical options for creating mutually enhancing relationships between people and Planet. Members of the Neighborhood Guide Team will:

- Work side-by-side with neighborhood leaders and residents to build and implement ecologically enriching plans for diverse local communities within Guilford County – most meetings will be held in the evenings and on weekends,
- Receive training in internationally recognized [Technology of Participation \(ToP\)](#)[®] facilitation methods proven to ensure active participation from people with diverse perspectives,
- Get hands-on experience using the community development methods created by the [Institute of Cultural Affairs \(ICA\)](#) in order to conduct grassroots projects with long-lasting effect and
- Help shape a contemporary worldview grounded in the writings of Thomas Berry and the [on-going research of Emerging Ecology](#) as a foundation for effective local actions.

Plans are underway to secure additional funding for this project so that members of Neighborhood Guide Team will be able to receive a nominal stipend during the months they are working directly with neighborhoods. Once the neighborhoods have completed their unique plans, Emerging Ecology will work with government agencies and private funding sources to undergird the implementation of the neighborhoods' proposals.
